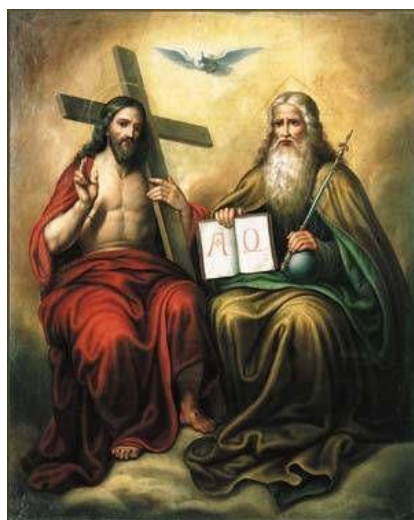

Annual Cemetery Dues: The contribution, per family, of at least \$20, can be turned in using a 'Cemetery Dues' envelope (located by the bulletins or in your contribution envelope box). As written in our Cemetery Policies & Procedures: *"Annual contributions of at least \$20 per family are collected each October for cemetery upkeep and maintenance. Failure to pay the annual upkeep fee will result in a parishioner being charged to be buried at HTC (\$1500 casket / \$250 urn); once an individual turns 18 years of age, even if they are still living in their parents' home, they are considered to be their own parish family and should, therefore, fulfill the responsibilities as any other parish family and pay the annual contribution to the HTC Cemetery Fund."*

Praised be Jesus Christ! Special thanks to Stephanie Wright, the Christian Mothers, the Knights of Columbus and other parishioners who helped with the Parish Picnic and Fun Day last Sunday. A good time was had by all. The children and adults enjoyed all the prizes they won in the competition.

Mark your calendars now to attend our Parish Mission on November 14-18. This is a good way to start off this Holiday and Holy Day time of year. Prepare yourself spiritually for these celebrations.

In this weekend's Gospel Jesus heals Bartimeus of blindness. Bartimeus, who was sitting on the side of the road, cries out, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me." When Jesus asked him what he wanted, Bartimeus says that he wants to see. Jesus heals him of his blindness. Jesus wants to heal us of our blindness. So many people in the world today are blind, they are not able to see that they are committing sin, they are blind to their sinfulness, or, maybe they do not want to see that they are sinning because they are happy with the sins they are doing. Do we really want to be healed of blindness to our sins? Do we want to be healed of our being prejudice against people of a different nationality or race than we are? Do we want to be healed of our addiction to beer or whisky or drugs? Do we want to be healed of the immoral life we are living in living together without being married? Do we want to be healed of using contraception so that we see it for the evil that it really is? Do we want to be healed of engaging in a promiscuous lifestyle? Do we want to be healed of our anger or our hatred of others? Do we want to be healed of laziness? Do we want to be healed of selfishness and pride? This list is really unending. Let us pray that we can come to Jesus in faith and courage as did Bartimeus and allow Jesus to heal us of what is unhealthy to our soul and to what is unhealthy to us as human beings created in the image and likeness of God.

K úvaze: A co kdyby Kristus přišel k tobě s touto nabídkou: "Co chceš, abych pro tebe udělal?" Co bys mu odpověděl? Možná bys byl zaskočen... třeba právě proto, že na rozdíl od toho slepce ke Kristu nevoláš: možná neznáš tu úpěnlivou modlitbu žebračka (a Bartimeus byl žebraček, byl zvyklý "prosit", žádat o slitování!), tu hlubokou modlitbu tryskající v nouzi - v situaci, kdy jsi v koncích a víš, že jen Někdo ný tě může zachránit.

Bartimeus skutečně prosil, tloukl a bušil - na dveře zpočátku zavřené a nedobytné, vždyť si ho Ježíš zpočátku nevídal a, navíc, mnozí ho okřikovali, aby zmlkl. Ale Bartimeus dál hledal a prosil ještě usilovněji... a našel smilování. Znáš Bartimeovu úpěnlivou modlitbu? Nemusí přitom jít o modlitbu za tvé potřeby, může to být i přímluvná modlitba za druhé. Bartimeus přitom volá s jistotou, že právě Ježíš je jeho zachránce - vždyť volá "Synu Davidův" (Mesiáš). A tak i tobě tento "zkušený prosebník" radí, jak volat k Ježíši - s jistotou, že On je tvůj Zachránce a Lékař, tvůj průvodce v temných údolích smrti, tvůj dobrý pastýř, který tě vede po cestách života (a vyvádí tě ze slepých uliček). A Bartimeus po tomto oslovení pokračuje: "Smiluj se nade mnou!" Jinými slovy: "Ukaž mi svou milost, dej mi dar!" Se stejnou důvěrou můžeš i ty k Ježíši volat: "Ukaž mi svou dobrotu, ty jsi nitro milosrdenství, ty znáš soucit - tobě není jedno, že skomírám. Ty jsi mé milosrdenství, mé útočiště." (Pastorace.cz)

O God, creator of all, you ordered the earth to bring forth life and crowned its goodness by creating the human family. In history's moment when all was ready, you sent your Son to dwell in time, "practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity." Teach us the sanctity of human love; show us the value of the Domestic Church; and help us to live in peace with all people, that we may share in your life forever. With the intercession of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, we ask this through Christ the Lord. Amen.

The witness of marriage is a witness of the love that Christ has for his bride, the Church. From the beginning to the end of scripture, we see the importance of marriage. We see the marriage, the union of God and his people throughout the Old Testament. In Christ, we see the sacrificial love of God who lays down his life for his bride. And in the Eucharist, we participate in the wedding feast of the lamb; the eternal wedding banquet of heaven. If you are married, in what way do you and your spouse demonstrate God's love to each other? If you are not married, in what ways do you demonstrate God's love to your neighbor?
