Dear friends in Christ,

This weekend is CSA pledge Sunday. Most of you should have received your Catholic Services Appeal pledge envelopes in the mail. Monday, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints. It is still a Holy Day even though it is not one of obligation this year since it is on a Monday. Please try to attend one of the three Masses - 7:00 am, 12 noon, 7:00 pm. Let us together give praise to God with all the angels and saints.

Tuesday, November 2, is All Souls' Day. Let us pray for all of our friends and relatives who have died. Mass will be at 7:00 am, 12 noon, and 6:00 pm.

On Saturday, November 6, we will have our annual Cemetery Mass at 11:00 am. Everyone is welcome to attend as we pray for all those who are buried in our cemetery and as we have the blessing of the graves.

In today's Gospel Jesus gives us the two great commandments: Love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. And, love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus takes the first commandment from the Book of Deuteronomy as we read in today's first reading. He adds the second one to it because it is the fulfilling of the last seven of the Ten Commandments. Jesus was well aware of how the religious leaders and most of the people treated those who were ill and poor. Jesus was also aware of how they did not really love God as they should. He is telling them that loving God and loving neighbor are equally important. You cannot say you love God while neglecting to love your neighbor. All of us need to remember this as we approach the Altar and receive the Body and Blood of Jesus in Holy Communion. May we see everyone as our neighbor, as our brother and sister, and love them as God loves them.
