Dear friends in Christ,

Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ! Our parish mission begins this weekend. Try to come every evening with your family and grow together in the understanding and the living out of your life of faith. I believe you will be truly inspired by the mission talks that Fr. Joseph Aytona will present this week. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday a light meal will be served in the PAC before the mission talks. On Thursday we will celebrate Mass which will include the final mission talk at 7:00 pm and the reception will be after Mass. This will give you the opportunity to visit with Fr. Joseph in person.

The work on Phase I & II of our long-range plan has begun. Please pray for the successful completion of this project and please consider making a donation towards the Building Fund. Next weekend we will celebrate the Last Sunday of Ordinary Time and the end of our Church Liturgical Year as we celebrate the great feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. As we approach the end of this Liturgical Year our readings today speak to us about the end times as we read from the Book of Daniel in our first reading and as we read from the thirteenth chapter of the Gospel of Mark. Jesus is telling us that the end will come and that we must be able to recognize the times so that we are prepared. But, He also tells us that no one knows when that will be, "neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." So, in other words, we must be prepared at all times. If we are prepared as we should be, then we will not worry about when these events will take place. So many people try to tell us that the end is near, or that on a certain date the world will end. Do not listen to them! Just be prepared and live as Jesus asks you to live and you will have nothing to worry about. Do not let anyone scare you into thinking something different than what God has revealed. You have faith, so take to heart the words of today's Psalm 16, "Therefore my heart is glad and my soul rejoices, my body, too, abides in confidence; because you will not abandon my soul to the netherworld, nor will you suffer your faithful one to undergo corruption." Be faithful and you will be with God and enjoy the "fullness of joys in your (God's) presence."
