Teach us the sanctity of human love; show us the value of the Domestic Church; and help us to live in peace with all people, that we may share in your life forever. With the intercession of St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church, we ask this through Christ the Lord. Amen.

Often when we hear the term "stewardship," the "three T's" come to mind: time, talent and treasure. While we often hear about these in regards to participation in the life of a parish or while people are seeking monetary donations, stewardship affects all aspects of life, as everything that we have comes from the Lord. As faithful Catholics, we are called to take care of and use well all the gifts that the Lord has given. Within the domestic church, our families provide ample opportunity for us to teach each other stewardship and hold each other accountable for our resources. For example, families can work together in serving the poor, joining a ministry at your parish that is in need, minimizing waste and consumable materials, spending time together in prayer, or simply serving each other lovingly when it is difficult. Children also rely on their parents to demonstrate what it means to give to the Church financially through tithing, as well as through giving of their time and talent. All of the faithful, young and old, are called to be stewards of God's gifts. As the holidays approach, how can your family grow in understanding of stewardship? How can you serve a person or family in need? It is never too early or too late to be good stewards of God's gifts.

Thank you to all of our cooks for the wonderful meals each evening: Moravian Club, KJT, Pastoral Council and the Christian Mothers. Each meal was delightful.

Here we are at the week of Thanksgiving. What does this holiday mean to you? Thanksgiving is a day set aside by our country to give thanks to God for the way in which He has blessed our land. We should attend Mass together as a family and give worship and thanks to our God first of all before we do anything else that day. Please attend Mass with your family on Thanksgiving. **We will have Thanksgiving Mass on Wednesday evening at 6:30 pm and on Thursday morning at 8:30 am.** Then after we have given thanks to God and have enjoyed a meal with our families, we can sit back and enjoy the Thanksgiving Day football games. As a Catholic family it would be good to reflect upon how much you have to be thankful for as a family and as individuals. Count your blessings and share your thankfulness with other members of your family. We as Catholics realize just how much we are blessed each day. That's one reason why we celebrate the Eucharist, the Mass, every day. Eucharist means "thanksgiving". It is our ultimate thanksgiving prayer to God. We give thanks to Jesus for giving us His Son, Jesus. We give thanks for the gift of salvation and for Jesus' dying and rising from the dead. We give thanks to Jesus for giving us His Body and Blood in Holy Communion at Mass, through which we are nurtured and strengthened in our faith. We give thanks for His constant presence with us when we are trying to live a life of faithfulness to Him. And we give thanks for the gift of the Holy Spirit who leads us in this life of faith. We express our thanksgiving as we give to our Lord in our weekly collections at Mass and in our special collections through the year. With this in mind, have you expressed your thankfulness to our Lord by giving to the annual Catholic Services Appeal? We do need to support our Church not only locally, but in our diocese and throughout the world as it is the Church founded by Jesus through His apostles. Let us give thanks to Him for this great and awesome gift.

Today we celebrate the great feast of Christ the King and the end of our Church Liturgical Year. Next Sunday we will begin the season of Advent. During the year we celebrate the entirety of the life of Jesus, from the time he is conceived in the womb of Mary to the time of His death, resurrection and ascension into heaven, where He reigns as King, seated on the throne as we read in the Book of Revelation. Most of the year we focus upon Jesus' public ministry and His daily activities. We are reminded that Jesus is with us as He ministers to us through His Church, through the Sacraments, through the Scriptures, through our life of prayer, and through other people. All we have to do is to submit ourselves to Him. This is difficult to do in today's world. Most people have been taught that they should only submit to their own opinions and ideas, they become the only source of authority and no one can tell them what to do. Also, they submit themselves to public opinion or the opinion of their friends. This is completely contrary to the teachings of Jesus. If He is to help us in this life we must submit ourselves to Him and Him alone and allow ourselves to be guided by the Church which He established. This takes great humility on our part. Is Jesus really the King of Kings and Lord of Lords in your life? Pray the following prayer together with your family and dedicate your family to Jesus Christ our King.

Act of Dedication of the Human Race to Jesus Christ the King

Loving Jesus, Redeemer of the human race, look down upon us as we kneel before you on this feast day. We belong to you and we wish always to be yours. In order that we may be more closely united with you, each one of us freely consecrates himself today to your most Sacred Heart.

We pray, Lord, that you will be king, not only of the faithful ones who have never abandoned you, but that you will be King also of those who have abandoned the faith. We pray especially for them, that they may soon return to their Father's house and to their Father's love.

We pray also that you will be King of those who are kept away from the church because of false opinions or misunderstandings. Call them back, Lord, to the truth and unity of the faith, so that soon there may once again be one flock and one Shepherd. Grant to your Church, Lord, assurance of freedom and immunity from harm. We pray for peace and tranquility among all the nations of the world. May all peoples praise your divine Heart which has loved us and saved us. To you be glory and honor forever. Amen.
