Dear friends in Christ,

Greetings to each of you in this holy Season of Advent. Preparation for Christmas is an important theme for Advent, but more is involved. Advent gives us a vision of our lives as Christians and shows us the possibilities of life. The vision of life that Advent gives us is twofold: it looks back to the first coming of Christ at Bethlehem, and it looks to the future when Christ will come again. In the interval between these two events we find meaning for our life as a Christian.

The Advent Penance Service schedule for the parishes in our deanery is in this bulletin. Please plan now to come with your family to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation together. Our Penance Service, which will be this Sunday, December 5, at 5:00 pm. There is no better way to prepare oneself than making a good Confession and then receiving our Lord with purity of heart and soul.

This week we celebrate a Holy Day of Obligation, The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, on Wednesday, December 8. All Catholics are to attend Mass on this Holy Day. Mass will be at 7:00 am, 12:00 noon, and, 6:30 pm.

In today's Gospel we hear how John the Baptist received his call to preach directly from God. His mission was to proclaim a baptism of repentance as a sign that the people were willing to change their ways and be faithful to God. This, he said, would prepare them for the coming of the Messiah. Jesus was not the warrior Messiah that many people expected. He was a humble teacher who preached love and peaceful reconciliation rather than war. Claiming God as his Father, Jesus said He had come to bring good news of salvation to the people, and even insisted that John baptize Him.

Just as John the Baptist prepared the way for the coming of Jesus, so to, we who are followers of Jesus, must continue to bring the same message to the world. In this Advent season, we recall His coming into our world to bring the light of salvation into the darkness of sin. By first reforming our own lives and then living in accord with Christ's teaching of unconditional love for all people, we can "prepare the way of the Lord" in our own day.

In the history of our salvation destruction and chaos entered the human race when sin came into the world. Through His life, death, and resurrection, Christ triumphed over sin and made it possible for us to participate in the blessings of God's eternal love. We can share in Christ's victory and extend its embrace to others by believing in Him and dedicating our lives to His way of love. To do this we must prepare ourselves as John the Baptist tells us. Prepare yourselves for Jesus and you too will be victorious over sin and death.

- 1. Přicházení k Janovi a otázky po skutcích obrácení (Lk 3,1-15);
- 2. Uzdravení od zla, které svazuje to už je třeba přijít (být přiveden) k Ježíšovi (Lk 4,31-37);
- 3. Víra vedoucí k uzdravení (Lk 5,12-16);
- 4. Povolání následování (Lk 5,10-11);
- 5. Maria a její postoj naprosté přijetí (Lk 1,38);

Praktický život nejde samozřejmě přesně po těchto stupních. Ale toto musí být jasné: obrátit se od zla ke Kristu je cestou k tomu, aby On mohl zcela uzdravit naše nitro (kořeny hříchu).

Přijmout Spasitele znamená svěřit věc své záchrany Ježíši a umožnit, aby Bůh skrze něho dělal své skutky. Zde jsme u postoje Mariina, u pravzoru církve, který můžeme a máme naplňovat. (Pastorace.cz)
