Dear friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! Now and forever! The glory of the Son has been revealed to us in many ways during these past two weeks. Let us share in His glory by sharing in His life.

This weekend the Season of Christmas comes to an end as we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Our Christmas lights and decorations will be taken down and stored away for another year. Tomorrow the Season of Ordinary Time begins and will continue until the beginning of Lent on March 2. During Ordinary Time we reflect on the daily life and ministry of Jesus Christ. As we all know, His life and ministry was not so ordinary. Therefore, our life and ministry should not be so ordinary either. Jesus calls us, by virtue of our baptism, to live a radical life of faithfulness to Him and to His Church.

This feast of the Baptism of the Lord points to a new beginning in the life of Jesus. The baptism of Jesus cannot be viewed through our Christian understanding of baptism. We understand baptism to be a washing away of original sin. For each of us it is a putting on the life of Christ. It is dying to sin and rising to new life in Jesus Christ. It is becoming a member of the Body of Christ by uniting oneself to the Christian community. It is becoming a child of God in and through Jesus Christ. Our understanding of baptism has a direct relation to Christ himself. For us, baptism says we are united with Christ.

The Baptism of Jesus is much different. It is the beginning of His public ministry, the beginning of the work which He was called to do by the Father. And as we all know, a new beginning can be a tough time in our life. I am sure that many of us have lost sleep, or spent many hours praying, or were filled with fear, or even shed tears over some new beginnings. This was probably also a difficult time for our Lord. He knew what He had to do. He knew that He would be rejected. He knew that eventually it would cost Him His life. Yet, this simple act of being immersed in water so beautifully tells us that His dying would bring about new life and that the Son of God was among the people: "You are my beloved Son. With you I am well pleased."

Since we are members of Christ's body, the Baptism of the Lord must take on a significant meaning in our own lives. The Baptism of the Lord calls us to do just as Jesus did: to accept our vocation in life and to become a public presence of God in the world. We cannot simply be private Christians, say our prayers in private, have a private set of beliefs of what is right and wrong, or a private value of God. No, we must be willing to be empowered by the Spirit to be a public sign, an active reality of Christ in the world. Too many Christians compromise their faith and morals in order to look good in the eyes of the world. If we do not begin to be whom we are called to be as baptized Catholic Christians, then we are failing not only God, but we are also failing ourselves and the whole Christian community. By doing this, we will fail to accomplish what God has called us to do through our baptism. Let us fulfill our baptism commitment by fulfilling the will of God in our lives by being faithful to Him, to His teachings and to His Church.

K úvaze: Ježíš opravdu není hlučný politik nebo křičící fanatik, v jeho "slabosti" je naopak síla. A právo na zemi založil, navzdory všem bezprávím, která ve světě existují. Toto právo pro nás zřejmě začíná v našem přijetí za syny křtem. A toto právo radikálně upravuje náš životní statut ve statut dětí a dědiců Božích.

Ježíš je ten, na něhož sestupuje Duch Boží. Může nás to trochu udivit, když víme, že Otec, Syn a Duch svatý jsou v Trojici jedno. Byla by ale škoda, kdybychom slova evangelia odmítli a kdybychom byli ochotni vidět Ducha svatého až na konci Ježíšova působení, tedy po nanebevstoupení. Vždyť všechny verze evangelistů, které mluví o křtu v Jordánu, jasně ukazují, že Duch svatý stojí na počátku Ježíšova působení. Ježíš veřejně působí tak, že moc a síla Ducha Božího je v jeho činech poznatelná. Je jím Bohem vybaven, zplnomocněn (jde o otázku "funkční", ne ontologickou, nejde o adopcionismus!). Ježíš vnáší osvobozující působení Ducha (uzdravení, exorcismy) do lidských dějin a zanechává ho ve své církvi. Proto církev má pokračovat v Ježíšově činnosti, v jeho úkolu, v jeho obnovovací činnosti a moci. (Pastorace.cz)

Bishop Joe Vásquez, in communion with Pope Francis, invites all the faithful to have their voices heard, leading up to the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, by completing the survey linked at www.austindiocese.org/synod-for-a-synodal-church. The survey will be available until Jan. 31, 2022. The questions center around the theme "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission." During this time parishes will also hold listening sessions. Once concluded, all responses will be compiled into a report and submitted to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). The USCCB will then submit a national report for the General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome. Please know, the information raised during the consultation phase in our diocese will be reviewed and used for our own pastoral planning.
