

**St. Cyril & Methodius Catholic Church, Dubina TX - a Diocesan Place of Pilgrimage:** On Monday, February 14, 2022, Bishop Brendan Cahill of the Diocese of Victoria will celebrate Mass starting at 10:30 am in Dubina, Texas, accompanied by the Czech Choir. This church was selected since it was the first parish founded in Texas under the patronage of Saints Cyril and Methodius. The saints feast day is celebrated in the United States on February 14, the date of St. Cyril's death while visiting Rome in 869 A.D.

During this Mass the Bishop will designate Saints Cyril and Methodius Catholic Church as a diocesan place of pilgrimage to give glory to God, to honor the Apostles to the Slavs and the Czech immigrants who brought the Faith to Texas given to them by the two brother saints. (These saints created an alphabet that gave literary [written] birth to the Slavic language used in their mission to the Moravians in 863 A. D. to evangelize and convert the pagans to our Faith.) These saints' feast day is celebrated in the United States on February 14<sup>th</sup>.

The celebration will continue with lunch after Mass in the church hall. The parishioners and the Czech Catholic Foundation of Texas (CCFT) extend an invitation to all interested Catholics and their friends to attend both the Mass and luncheon. ## Dear friends in Christ.

Thank you to everyone who helped out with the Altar Server Appreciation event this past Sunday. A good time was had by all.

Thank you to everyone who sent in names for Called By Name Sunday. If you have not mailed in a name you may still do so this week. Envelopes are in the foyer of the church and also at the south side entrance. Let us all pray for and encourage vocations to the priesthood and religious life in our parish.

This Monday, February 14, is the feast of Sts. Cyril and Methodius and St. Valentine. These were saints that gave their life for the good of the Kingdom of God. May we have the same faith and courage to live our lives as Catholic Christians in the world. Our parish celebration of the feast of Sts. Cyril and Methodius will be next Sunday, February 20, with Mass at 5:00 pm. After Mass supper will be served in the PAC. All are invited to attend.

In today's Gospel we find Jesus with the twelve apostles coming down from the mountain to find a large crowd of people waiting for them. Jesus teaches them the Beatitudes. Jesus is calling the people who are listening to Him to a conversion of heart and to a different way of thinking. Jesus is telling them that true joy only comes when a person looks for it in God and when you live as God commands. Are you looking for this joy? What is keeping you from it?

In today's readings there are two themes that can be found in all of the readings. These are the themes of trust and social justice. So I ask you the question: "In whom do you put your trust?" Do you find trust in a friend or neighbor or spouse or parent? How many times did you think you could trust someone and then come to find out that you could not? Or do you find your trust in money or your job or other things of this world? Or maybe you only trust yourself and no one else. In the first reading we heard "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord." These are very strong words. The prophet Jeremiah wanted the people to realize that ultimately, they could only find their trust in God. That is why he says, "Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is the Lord." Jeremiah knew that if we only find our trust in ourselves or other people or in the things of this world, then we will be very disappointed with life. How many times have you told someone a secret and told them not to tell anyone else and then later on you found out that they had told someone else the secret that you did not want anyone else to hear? I know that this has happened to everyone. Usually we end up being embarrassed by what we had said.

Jesus came to tell us that we can only trust in Him and His Church. That is why He tells us in the gospel reading, "Blessed are you poor, blessed are you who hunger, blessed are you who are weeping, blessed shall you be when men hate you." Because when you are poor, hungry, sad, and hated by others, you have no one else to trust but God. When all else fails, it is God alone in whom you can put your trust. Usually, the rich trust in their money for happiness and security, those who are full trust in the food they eat for satisfaction, those who laugh constantly trust only in good feelings, and those people who receive honor and praise all the time only find trust in themselves and not in God. I believe that I can truly say that most of us here do find our trust in God and not in these other things. It is in our trusting in God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, that we find meaning and happiness in our life. That is why we come to Mass every week, because we have faith and trust in God.

The gospel reading also reminds us of the need for us to be generous with what we have in this life. It tells us that those who have plenty should give to those who have little. It is the "Just" thing to do. Christ warns us that those who do not share their wealth in helping the poor and the hungry, they will be cursed and will not receive eternal life as promised us by Christ. If we have all that we need in life to live, then we are rich even though we may not have big bank accounts. We are to give from what we have, no matter how much or little we may have. We should all help those who have nothing at all. Many people say that they have worked hard for what they have and that they deserve what they have and are not going to give anything to anyone. They do not realize that all that they have is a gift from God and should be shared with others.

May we all trust only in the Lord for complete happiness and peace in our lives and give to others from what God has given to us. Our reward will be great in heaven. This is good news for all who hear and accept it today.


