### Dear friends in Christ,

Peace be with you. During the season of Lent we are all called to make extra sacrifices or acts of penance. Hopefully these will lead to a change in our life so that we live better lives that truly reflect what it means to live as a Christian in the world. So these sacrifices or penances should have a lasting effect. With this in mind we need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church. Dressing appropriately is a small sacrifice to pay as you come to worship our Lord. Let us be willing to make this sacrifice all year long so as to give faithful witness that Mass is important to us and that we are willing to do something a little different to help others realize this as well.

In today's first reading God speaks to Moses through the burning bush. God calls Moses on a mission to bring liberation to the Israelites who were enslaved in Egypt. God also reveals Himself to Moses as "I am who am", which translates "Yahweh." Just as God revealed Himself to Moses and sent him on a mission to liberate the Israelites from slavery, God reveals Himself to each of us through His Son, Jesus, and through His Catholic Church. God also calls each of us on a mission and the mission is that of Jesus. We are all called to help others to be liberated from sin so that they may live in freedom as children of God. Are you accepting God's mission in your life? May we all help one another to be freed from sin and help each other to repent as Jesus says in today's Gospel. In doing so we will produce good fruit and will not be cut out of the Kingdom of God.

Don't forget to attend **Stations of the Cross** every week during Lent with your family. Stations are on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. Come and pray the Way of the Cross and walk with our Lord in His suffering so that you can experience the resurrection with Him.

Be sure to make a good confession during Lent. The Penance Services for our deanery are listed in this bulletin.

**K úvaze:** Katechismus katolické církve ve svém prvním odstavci konstatuje: "Bůh, jenž je sám v sobě nekonečně dokonalý a blažený, v úradku své ryzí dobroty, ze své svobodné vůle stvořil člověka, aby mu dal účast na svém blaženém životě" (KKC 1). Účast na Božím životě je něco velkolepého, něco naším rozumem neobsáhnutelného, přesto do člověka vložil touhu Boží život hledat, poznávat a sdílet.

Mojžíš se setkal s Hospodinem díky tomu, že byl zvídavý, že chtěl přijít na kloub divu hořícího keře. Na základě snahy poznávat Boha vysvětluje apoštol Pavel naplnění předobrazů Starého zákona na Kristu. Díky poslání naučit rozeznávat "znamení času" přichází Ježíš mezi lidi, aby jim vysvětlil jednání a úmysly svého nebeského Otce.

"Toto poznání víry je možné pouze v Duchu svatém," učí Katechismus, "přichází nám vstříc a vzbuzuje v nás víru" (KKC 683). Když začneme poznávat Boha skrze studium, skrze intenzivní a systematické rozjímání, nebo skrze doteky uměleckých děl, budeme chtít stále více. Bůh bude znásobovat naši touhu. ## **Spring Cleaning for Freedom**

So many of us have accumulated much more than we need. It bursts from our closets, overflows our shelves and clutters our lives. Lent might be a wonderful time to deliberately release ourselves from the many "things" we own by cleaning out our closets and simplifying our lives in a prayerful and intentional way. On one level, this is ridding ourselves of things we don't need, or things that we hated to part with except that they are so "out of style." Certainly, many of us have many things that are "extra" or "unneeded" for us, but could be wonderful for those who can't afford to buy clothes at a store.

Another level of this journey into personal freedom is to ask ourselves how much I really do need. How many sweaters do I want to choose to have? How many jackets, sport shirts, dresses, shoes? How much jewelry? How much sporting equipment? How much electronic equipment? How many sets of silverware or dishes? How much of so many things we have in our lives? We can get as serious and go as deeply into this as we desire to find fruit. This would not be the question above: should I get rid of what I don't need? This takes us into giving up good stuff, perhaps stuff I'm attached to, because I want to experience the exercise of freedom. I do this because I sense that I'm not free in some areas that are tremendously important for me, important for my salvation, and growing in freedom before the things of my life can be a great grace. This freedom, too, will place us in greater solidarity with those who find such great happiness and joy in trusting in God, while having so much less than we imagine we could survive on.

What else might I do, that fits with my circumstances and the needs around me and in the world?

## Family Conversion - Relationship Conversion

Lent can be a good time to reflect on the people who mean the most to us and the relationships we hold most dear. For those of us who live in industrialized countries, it can be jarring to realize that our time together as a family might amount to no more than a few minutes a day. Our lives are independent as we scatter in different directions each day for work, school or childcare. This season of reflection and renewal might be an appropriate time to pray about our family lives and how we can be more thoughtful and prayerful about Lent as a family. Perhaps we could hold a family meeting over dinner or some other relaxed place. We could discuss Lent and the symbols of the season. We might want to talk about how our faith life is not a journey we make alone, but one we are in as a community, as a family.

One Lenten family practice might include a daily act of love for our family. Can we look around and see some small thing that needs to be done to make our lives together better? Is there laundry to sort or dishes to be washed? Is there a floor that needs sweeping or a room that needs dusting? Just one effort by each of us each day can make a dramatic difference in sharing the workload in the family. The grace we are reaching for goes beyond getting the garbage taken out, for example. We know it is a grace when my experience of taking the garbage out, feels to me like an act of love, an act of solidarity as a family. Perhaps the simplest way to prepare for this grace is to pray:

# Dear Lord, may this simple, ordinary sacrifice of my time for the sake of those I love, draw us closer together as a family whose hearts you are drawing to yourself in the togetherness of our family love.

One of the real graces of Lent has to do with forgiveness and reconciliation – mercy and healing. This is never simply a matter between Jesus and me. It always has something to do with my family and with my relationships – how we are with each other. What in us needs mercy and healing? What patterns that we have need our reflections and common family choices and actions this Lent?
