Dear Parishioners.

May the peace and love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with each of you. We have had a lot of beautiful weather this past few weeks but our farmers and those with gardens need some rain. Let us pray for rain and for favorable weather for our farmers and ranchers. Lent is quickly passing by and Holy Week will be here soon. Some of you may already be making plans for Holy Week and Easter. During Holy Week we will have Stations of the Cross on Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. Our Mass schedule for the Easter Triduum will be as follows:

Holy Thursday - 7:00 p.m.
Good Friday - 3:00 pm & 7:00 p.m.
Holy Saturday - 8:30 p.m.
Easter Sunday - 6:30 a.m., 8:30 a.m. & 10:30 a.m.

The Easter Triduum during Holy Week is our most sacred and solemn week of the whole year. We should make it a priority to attend the celebrations on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday. Please consider making it a priority in your life and the life of your family, setting aside other non-religious activities that may conflict with these sacred days. Let us be faithful to God.

We will be having **Altar Server practice** for each of the above celebrations. Altar Servers will have practice for Holy Thursday on Palm Sunday, April 10, following the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Altar Server practice for Good Friday, for both Services, will be after the 7:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Thursday, and on Holy Saturday practice will be at 11:00 a.m. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for you and be sure to tell them to be at the practice for that particular day. Also please call the parish office so that we will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

In today's gospel we hear the story of the Prodigal Son. The son squanders his inheritance and then returns, out of desperation, to the father and asks for forgiveness. The father runs out to meet him and gives forgiveness even before it is asked for. Our Heavenly Father runs out to meet us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) to offer us forgiveness. Are we running to Him? Or, is pride keeping us from asking the Father for forgiveness in this special Sacrament. Check this bulletin for the times for confession in all the neighboring parishes and then schedule the time you can run to the Father and ask for forgiveness of your sins. This is a great gift! May we all accept what the Father is giving us.

The Prodigal son came to recognize his faults and failings. He saw the wrong he had done. Do we recognize our faults and failing, our bad habits? Are we taking time in this Season of Lent to do something about them. Some of you could change some bad habits, such as not coming to Mass late and not leaving Mass early. Also, not wearing shorts to Mass. It is a matter of showing respect and reverence to our Lord. Please remember that when we come to Mass we come to worship our God and to spend some time in His Presence. Let us dress accordingly and remember why it is we are coming to Mass.

Please join us with your family for **Stations of the Cross** this Wednesday, at 6:30 pm. By meditating upon the Stations of the Cross we unite ourselves to the suffering of Jesus and we more appreciate all that He suffered for us. In doing so we experience in a deeper way His resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Every year during Holy Week the Church celebrates the annual Chrism Mass. At this Mass all of the priests of the diocese are present, they renew their priestly promises and the Holy Oils of the Sick, Catechumens, and Sacred Chrism are blessed by the bishop and distributed to all the parishes of the Diocese. If you have never been to a Chrism Mass I invite you to attend. It is truly a beautiful celebration. The Chrism Mass will be on Tuesday, April 12, at 10:30 am at St. Vincent DePaul Parish in northwest Austin. If you decide to attend I recommend you arriving early to get a good place to sit.

May all of you continue to have a spiritually renewing Season of Lent as we prepare ourselves for Holy Week and the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord at Easter.
