Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, the beginning of Holy Week. Thursday through Sunday of Holy Week are the most solemn days of our Church Liturgical Year. This is a very sacred time and we should set aside all other activities so that we are able to attend all of the Holy Week celebrations. In order to really experience the fullness of these days a person needs to attend every day as the theme of the Redemption is begun at the beginning of the Easter Triduum, Holy Thursday, and ends with the triumphant conclusion upon the celebration of the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Sunday. Our full attention should be given to celebrate these most sacred rites. All services should take priority over any other event because celebrating Holy Week is what we are all about as a Catholic People. Let us do our best to show our love for our Saviour by our faithfulness to these days. All of you should have made a good confession so that you are spiritually prepared to celebrate these holy days. If you have not had an opportunity yet to go to confession, I will be hearing confessions this week at various times: Monday - 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm; Tuesday - 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm; Wednesday - 5:15 pm to 6:05 pm and 7:00 pm - 8:00 pm. Please note: There will not be any confessions on Holy Saturday or Easter Sunday.

We will be having Altar Server practice for each of the above celebrations. Altar Servers practice for Holy Thursday will be on Palm Sunday, April 10, following the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Altar Server practice for both Good Friday Services will be after the 7:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Thursday, and on Holy Saturday practice will be at 11:00 a.m. All Altar Servers who are scheduled to serve at each of the above celebrations are asked to be at these practices. If you are not able to serve when scheduled, please find a substitute for you and be sure to tell them to be at the practice for that particular day. Also please call the parish office so that we will know who will be serving. Thank you to all of you for serving at God's Altar.

We will have **Stations of the Cross** this Wednesday at 6:30 pm. Please try to attend so your experience of Holy Week can be all that it can be. In today's gospel we recall the event of Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem. Then, as we read the Passion, we hear about the arrest, suffering, crucifixion and death of Jesus. I would encourage you to spend some time today reflecting on these events and what meaning they have for you as you live your Christian faith.

The weather has been much warmer lately. Usually when summer approaches we are tempted to dress rather lightly or skimpy for Mass. We need to remember that as we come to Mass we come to worship God and to receive His Son in Holy Communion. We should dress in a way that shows respect for God. The general rule that I believe is appropriate is that anyone over 6 years of age should not wear shorts to Mass. Also, girls and ladies should wear blouses or dresses that are appropriate for Mass, nothing strapless or no spaghetti straps. Some say that God doesn't care what you wear to Mass. Well, that may be so. But the question should be "do you love God enough that you care what you wear to Mass?" Do you stand in honor in His presence? Also, if you dress appropriately for Mass you will not be cold in church from the air conditioning. If the air is blowing on you and you are cold, try to move to another part of the church.

A few months ago I asked that those who wish to kneel to receive Holy Communion to please kneel at the Communion Rail. I think this makes it much easier for you to kneel and stand up again. So, I ask that you do not kneel in the aisle to receive Holy Communion. In the early Church deacons were chosen and commissioned to take Holy Communion to the sick. For many years now they have also been given the commission to help distribute Holy Communion at Mass even though their hands are not consecrated. The hands of the priests are consecrated to make present the Body and Blood of Jesus during the consecration at Mass. But other people, such as the deacon, may help with distribution of Holy Communion at Mass even though their hands are not consecrated. That is why in more recent times Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion were commissioned to also assist with taking Holy Communion to the homebound and to assist at Mass. This authority comes from Jesus Christ Himself. He told Peter in Matthew 16:19, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." This authority has been passed on from St. Peter to all Popes. So, when the Pope speaks in matters of Church order and rules, such as the distribution of Holy Communion, he speaks with the authority of Jesus. So, let us humble ourselves and accept the rules and regulations of the Church as they are given to us by Jesus through the authority of the Pope and the Church's magisterium.

Good Friday marks the beginning of the Divine Mercy Novena. Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet daily and experience the mercy of God. We will have our **Divine Mercy Devotion on Sunday, April 24, Divine Mercy Sunday, at 3:00 pm.** This devotion will consists of the blessing of the image of Divine Mercy, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Divine Mercy Litany, Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction. Everyone is invited and encouraged to attend.

May all of you have a spiritually renewing Holy Week and a joyful celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday.

K ZAMYŠLENÍ: Když se Ježíš narodil v Judském Betlémě, otevřelo se tenkrát nebe a pastýři slyšeli chvalozpěv andělů: "Sláva na výsosti Bohu a na zemi pokoj mezi lidmi; Bůh v nich má zalíbení" (Lk 2,14). Tehdy to bylo volání z nebe, nyní poznali mnozí lidé, kým je ten, který přichází a proč. Volá tedy země "Požehnaný král, který přichází ve jménu Hospodinově. Na nebi pokoj a sláva na výsostech!" Ve chvíli vjezdu do Jeruzaléma se Ježíšova mise blíží k vrcholu. Připomeňme si rozhovor Piláta s Ježíšem: "Pilát mu řekl: "Jsi tedy přece král?' Ježíš odpověděl: "Ty sám říkáš, že jsem král. Já jsem se proto narodil a proto jsem přišel na svět, abych vydal svědectví pravdě. Každý, kdo je z pravdy, slyší můj hlas" (Jan 18,37).

Květnou neboli Palmovou nedělí začíná tak zvaný Svatý týden. Průvodem jsme vešli do chrámu, kde se bude tento posvátný čas odehrávat. Vešli jsme sem, do Večeřadla, kde Ježíš se svými učedníky slavil Poslední večeři, kde prožil ono hluboké zachvění tváří tvář hříchu světa, kam po svém vzkříšení přišel, byť dveře měli učedníci ze strachu zavřeny a kam sestoupil Duch svatý při prvních letnicích. Zde se budou dít v následujících dnech zázraky prozření, uvěření, obrácení, rozhodnutí.

Utíkejme se do tohoto místa co nejčastěji, protože nás sem přivedl a doprovodil Ježíš, pokorný král, služebník člověka, Spasitel.
